



## Job pack: National Volunteer Coordinator 2022-2023

Volunteers are at **the heart of StreetDoctors**, without them we couldn't deliver our lifesaving training that empowers young people to save lives, and reflect on the consequences of street violence. Applying to be our National Volunteer Coordinator (NVC) gives you a **unique opportunity** to be at the centre of supporting and strengthening our volunteer movement, so we can reach more young people affected by violence across the UK.

This year-long post will give you the opportunity to be at the centre of our HQ staff team in a paid post. It has been held by a variety of volunteers in the past, both students and graduates. It is an incredibly varied role, which adapts to the needs of StreetDoctors each year, but always retains a **key leadership role** in supporting every volunteer team across the UK.

**The candidate appointed to post for 2022 - 2023 will have these specific opportunities:**

- Supporting the implementation of the revised annual recruitment and training cycle, providing a comprehensive support programme for volunteers
- Coordinating session delivery nationally for both digital and in person sessions
- Supporting the development and launch of new content as part of StreetDoctors Reducing Violence Programme
- Creating online resources and events to increase engagement with volunteers and young people
- Boosting the number of nurses and paramedics in our volunteer cohort
- Supporting the development of a new database system to be used by volunteers



# Job Description

<b>Job Title</b>	National Volunteer Coordinator
<b>Reporting to</b>	Youth Engagement Manager (YEM)
<b>Responsible for</b>	Leading volunteer team support, both locally and at national events; assisting YEM with all aspects of volunteer engagement including recruitment of volunteers and setting up local teams, delivering an improved annual training cycle, the training and oversight of specialist groups, with particular responsibility for Delivery Specialists, supporting volunteer vetting and safeguarding; assisting Partnerships Manager and London Partnership Officer and Northern Partnership Officer in the development and maintenance of key external relationships with delivery partners.
<b>Location</b>	Can be based outside of London but regular travel will be required (individual circumstances can be discussed at interview).
<b>Hours</b>	Full time 37.5 hours a week with some weekend and evening work, hours including protected clinical time (to be determined). We are open to flexible working including compressed hours and job share can be considered.
<b>Salary</b>	£28,000
<b>Probationary Period</b>	3 months
<b>Contract</b>	One year
<b>Notice Period</b>	2 months
<b>Start Date</b>	July 2022

StreetDoctors is committed to ensuring that we are a welcoming, inclusive and diverse team that benefits from a broad spectrum of experiences and backgrounds. We particularly welcome applications from candidates from a diverse range of backgrounds and with experience of living with the contextual drivers of violence affecting young people.

## Main responsibilities

### 1. Day to day delivery management and support of volunteer engagement at all levels within StreetDoctors

- Work closely with local teams the Partnership Manager, London and Northern Partnerships Officer to optimise training session opportunities for all volunteers.
- Maintain close relationships with all Team and Deputy Team Leaders to support local delivery across the UK.
- Pro-actively support all teams with volunteer recruitment, retention and engagement through regular catch ups, visits, and calls.
- Be the initial point of contact for every volunteer and be responsible for all messaging that goes out to volunteers. For volunteers based in London and Northern teams this responsibility is sits with the Partnerships Officers with support from the NVC.

- Work with the staff team to contribute to internal and external communications, including social media channels and volunteer newsletters.
- Communicate strategic and organisational aims to local teams, ensuring that volunteers understand how strategic aims and initiatives align with local activities and that volunteer ideas, views, concerns and voices are represented within the staff team.
- Manage the online volunteer Playbook, making sure content is up to date and relevant.
- Work with the CEO to support and oversee StreetDoctors impact and support the gathering of impact evidence.
- Be a pioneer and champion for the database systems that support local volunteer delivery and train volunteers how to use them.
- Act as a spokesperson for StreetDoctors when necessary, clearly explaining key messages to media and key stakeholders with support from the staff team.
- Support the Partnerships Manager and Youth Engagement Manager to produce quarterly Board reports including updates about local volunteer team management, training data and relationships with delivery partners/stakeholders.
- Coordinate session delivery and support teams to deliver high calibre sessions, liaising with delivery partners and supporting management of specific delivery packages nationally alongside the Partnerships Manager.

## **2. Content creation and medical knowledge application**

- Support the development of new session content, working closely with the Partnership Manager and CEO, to devise new training session in line with medical guidance.
- Continuous improvement of existing content with up-to-date medical information and understanding of both digital and face-to-face delivery methods.
- Keep up to date with the Resuscitation Council guidance and international guidance on best practice for first aid training, ensuring this is implemented in StreetDoctors training.

## **3. Work with the staff team to implement StreetDoctors Youth Participation Plan**

- Supporting recruitment of volunteers to youth engagement programmes, including Stepwise.
- Support young people to be part of reviewing current training content and co-creating new content of additional training topics.

## **4. Support the organisation of all volunteer training events**

- Work with volunteers and the staff team to arrange, design and facilitate volunteer training events; including newly recruited volunteers, our national conference, Team Leader and Deputy Team Leader training days and Specialist days.
- Support evaluation and development of all volunteer training content.

## **5. Safeguarding and volunteer vetting**

- Report all safeguarding and other incidents to the staff members responsible as set out in StreetDoctors policies and procedures.
- Administer the process of volunteer recruitment with support from the staff team, in particular volunteer references, DBS and PVG applications.
- Undertake training in safeguarding and act in accordance with safeguarding policies and procedures set out by the organisation

**6. Work closely with the staff team to support expansion and relationships with delivery partners and other stakeholders, including:**

- Support the Partnerships Manager and local teams to review, maintain and build relationships with local delivery partners.
- Liaise between the volunteer teams and delivery partners when establishing management of newly commissioned packages.
- Work with the staff team to establish new volunteer teams as needed.
